Deer Proof Plants

It is getting to that time of year when many minds start to think once again about gardening. One issue that seems to come up over and over again is how to deer proof your garden. I'm passing along some information from the February/March issue of *Organic Gardening* on dealing with this problem in terms of what to plant that will not be attractive to deer.

The article states that no plant is 100% deer proof but lists some of the following things that deer find unappealing on a menu.

Deer dislike foliage that is fuzzy, leathery, sharp-edged, spiny, prickly, silver, black or bronze color, strongly scented or poisonous.

Some poisonous plants are:

Hellebores which are filled with alkaloid toxins, ferns, daffodils, snowdrops and autumn crocus.

Bad Smelling plants (to deer):

Rosemary, lavender, catmint and salvias.

Acrid Sap Plants:

The leaves and stems of peonies contain an acrid sap that deer dislike. Spurges contain a latex sap as do bluestars and butterfly weed.

Fuzzy Leaves:

Lambs Ears, Mulleins (*Verbascum*), and *Artemisia*

Unappetizing Color:

Black Beauty snakeroot, Purple Knockout leaf sage, and Lime Rickey heuchera.

This is a tiny list of plants that deer tend to avoid but if you keep in mind the color, scent and foliage that deer dislike I'm sure you'll come up with lots more plants.

Keep in mind that deer prefer soft, bland tasting plants with high water content. Some favorites of deer are daylilies, hostas, roses and tulips.

Happy gardening.
