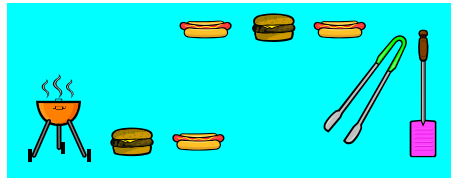
CALLING ALL VOLUNTEERS

How about another fall get-away? The survey results from the Chicago trip in December indicated a strong interest in Toronto, Ontario. Before we attempt to book a hotel, we would really appreciate an indication of those individuals and couples seriously interested in going. The following is an overview of the trip including approximate costs.

WHEN: Tuesday, November 6 to Friday; November 9 (Best hotel rates available during this time.)

HOTEL: Royal York Hotel (directly across the street from Union Station; so no cabs are needed). Group rate for standard double room (for individual or couple) is \$170 (Canadian) per night including taxes.

TRAIN: VIA Rail. Going: Depart Windsor on 11/6 at 9:05 AM, arriving Toronto at 1:11 PM
Return: Depart Toronto at 5:30 PM, arriving Windsor at 9:59 PM
Fare: Estimated at \$120 per person (\$240 per couple)

Note: Departure from Windsor is necessary as (1) there are no direct Amtrak trains to Toronto from Michigan that cross at Detroit or Port Huron and (2) Sarnia has only two departure times - at 6:11 AM (arriving 10:50 AM) or 6:37 PM (arriving 11:20 PM)

APPROXIMATE TOTAL COST FOR HOTEL AND TRAIN IS \$750 PER COUPLE.
