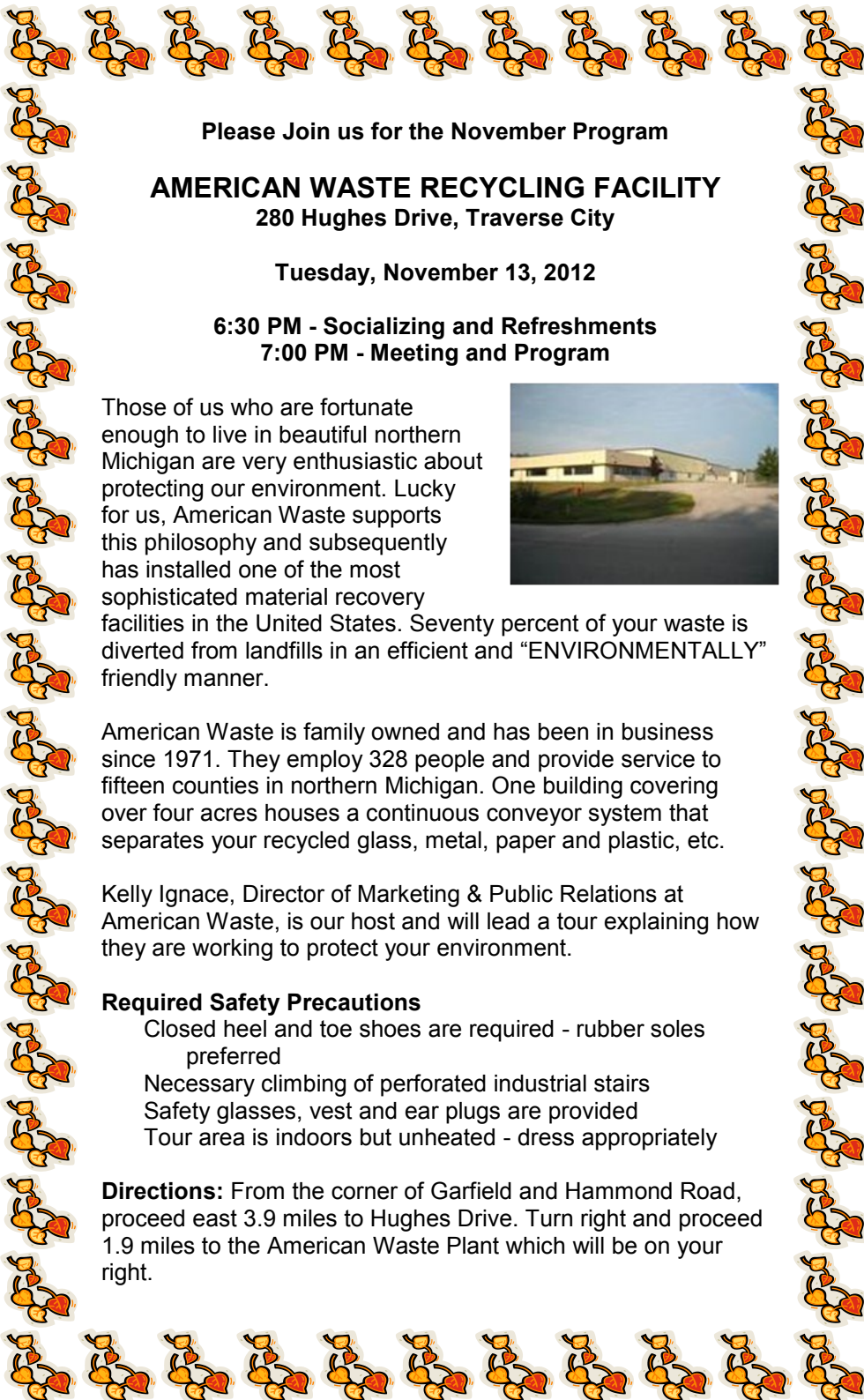

So, in summary, this is how it will work:

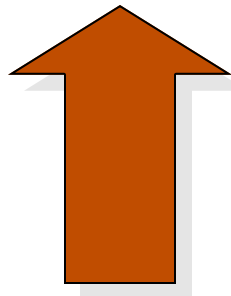
- Paper copies of the newsletter, **Newcomers News**, will be printed and mailed to all members three to four times a year
